### "Helping Hand for Ukraine" International Relief Project

- provides psychological assistance improves socio-emotional well-being of children and parents traumatized by Russian aggression and war against Ukraine, who are displaced internally and outside Ukraine.
- **empowers** trainers trains psychologists, social workers and teachers to work with traumatized children using "Children and War. Teaching Recovery Techniques".

#### We aim to:

- Prevent PTSD and depression in children traumatized by war
- Prevent the need in specialized treatment in future
- Help children learn how to cope with stress
- Foster better social adaptation of IDPs





#### "Helping Hand for Ukraine"



**Project goal** is to improve the socioemotional well-being and psychological state of Ukrainian children and adults with war trauma (IDPs and refugees), lessen their anxiety and empower them with skills to cope with traumatic experience and to prevent PTSD and further complications in the future.

#### **Objectives:**

- To equip psychologists, educators, volunteers, social workers with innovative recovery techniques for coping with war trauma;
- To empower children and adults with skills to cope with their traumatic experience using self-help techniques, relaxation and recovery tools in conditions of intense war related stress.





# "Children and War. Teaching Recovery Techniques" Methodology

### «Children and War. Teaching Recovery Techniques»

- developed by the Center for Crisis Psychology (Bergen, Norway) and the Institute of Psychiatry (London, Great Britain).

In Ukraine, the manual was translated and adapted by the experts from the Ukrainian Institute of Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (Lviv, Ukraine).

Funding for the translation and methodological adaptation was provided by the Canada-Ukraine Foundation.





#### February 24 – August 24, 2022

Therapeutic classes according to the methodology "Children and War. Teaching Recovery Techniques" were held throughout Ukraine, in particular, in Kyiv, Dnipro, Zhytomyr, Pereyaslav, Nemishaevo, Lviv, Drohobych, Truskavets, Novoyavorivsk, Boryslav, Skhidnytsia, Ivano-Frankivsk, Khmelnytskyy, Odesa, Rivne, Kamianets-Podilskyy, Pylypets, Volovets, Uzhgorod, Vinnytsia, Chernivtsi, Ternopil, Lutsk, Rybakivka, Mykolaiv, Chornomorsk, Bucha, Poltava, Nikopol, Kropyvnytskyy, Cherkassy, Kharkiv, Chernihiv, Irpin.





#### 22 trainings for trainers were held








#### 722 trainers were trained















#### 108 therapeutic groups for adults were held














#### 1037 adults with war trauma took part













#### 158 therapeutic groups for children were held










#### 1645 children with war trauma took part

### 225 refugee children who left Ukraine with their mothers took part
























4 camps for IDP's children in Zakarpattia, Prykarpattia, and Kamianets-Podilskyy were organized
