PROJECT SCALE AND SOCIAL IMPACT

The “Helping Hand for Ukraine” project, implemented by the “HOPE *worldwide* Ukraine” Charity Foundation, has been operating since 2015. It focuses on psychological recovery and the prevention of PTSD among children and adults affected by war-related trauma.

PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPACT OF WAR ON CHILDREN

Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is one of the most common mental health conditions among children who have experienced war.



It manifests through heightened anxiety, nightmares, difficulties in learning, and challenges with socialization.

According to research, up to 44% of children in Ukraine are at risk of developing PTSD, while in frontline regions this figure reaches up to 68.9% (Future Index, 2025; field studies and humanitarian assessments, 2022–2024).

REAL IMPACT: STORIES OF RECOVERY



Sumy Region

A child overcame panic attacks during air raid alerts and returned to school.

Kharkiv Region

A teenager who lost their home and lived in complete isolation successfully reintegrated into society.

Donetsk Region

A child was freed from chronic nightmares through psychological stabilization techniques.

Zaporizhzhia Region

A child regained emotional stability while coping with a parent serving on the front line.

METHODOLOGY AND APPROACH

The project uses the international methodology “Children and War: Teaching Recovery Techniques” (United Kingdom, Norway).

It is designed to address traumatic stress and reduce the risk of PTSD.

The methodology has been implemented in more than 20 countries worldwide, and our project in Ukraine is one of the largest examples of its implementation.
